One day course – Thursday 31 August 2017

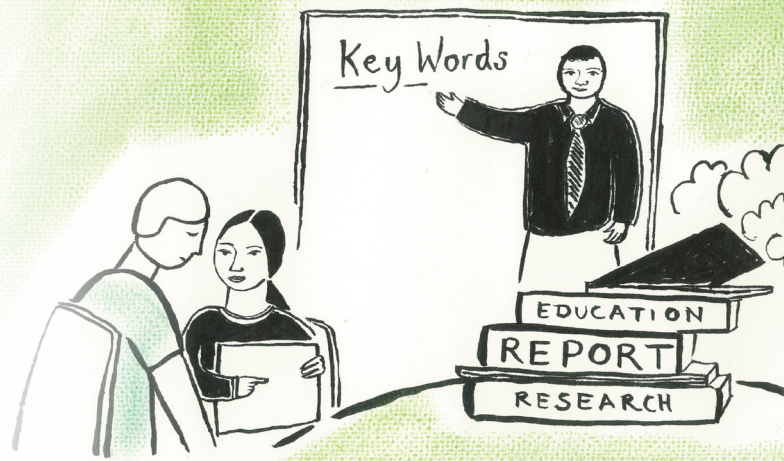
