Skills for EAL Teacher Educators: Train the Trainer



This course is for teacher educators who are seeking inspiring ways to facilitate effective, long-lasting and transferable teacher learning. - A framework for teacher planning sessions
- Opportunities to share ideas and engage with fellow practitioners
